**South Florida AGC and Florida East Coast AGC, and Sheridan Technical Center are joining forces for the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual South Florida Safety Expo specifically designed for project superintendents, foremen and “front line” employees.**

**The South Florida and Florida East Coast Chapters of the Associated General Contractors of America (AGC), and Sheridan Technical Center announced today that they will conduct the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual South Florida Safety Expo May 15, 2010. The construction industry in South Florida has drawn negative attention in the past for unsafe job sites and unnecessary accidents. Statistics now indicate that the number of fatalities and accidents in our area have dropped by nearly 50% in the past two years, as a result of partnership of OSHA and AGC through the Susan B. Harwood Safety Training Grant program, that allowed the “fall protection” training of over 8,000 construction workers in South Florida.**

**Darlene Fossum, Local Area OSHA Director states, “This training program take us to the next step in helping companies build a strong and effective safety and health culture. Throughout our partnership with AGC, together we have provided education and information critical to the development of a strong safety and health program. This upcoming Safety Expo is yet another effective tool developed by AGC to help their members strengthen their safety and health culture. The safety classes are directed at everyone working in the construction and general industry by helping them understand their responsibilities towards safety and health by enforcing company policies and federal standards they strengthen and protect their company’s human resources and economical status.”**

Classes offered at the Expo will be approximately two hours in length and be offered in the morning and afternoon session. The topics covered will be: CPR/First Aid/AED, Forklift, Fall

Protection, Electrical Safety, Struck-By, Caught In-between, Scaffolding, Trenching, Confined Space, Ariel Lifts, Health in Construction, Hurricane Preparation, PPE, and Rigging.

The Safety Expo will be held at Sheridan Technical Center located at 5400 Sheridan Street, Hollywood, Florida 33201 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
